the chance. As they traveled toward India, he hurt her. Approaching the border of India, Kalpa staggered along aimless and hopeless. At the border some young women dressed in purple called to her and began asking questions.

"Where was she going?"

"Did she know the man accompanying her?"

"Had he attempted to hurt her in any way?"

"Would she like some help?"

When 10/40's surveillance workers understood Kalpa's desperate situation, they secured a place for her to stay in a recovery home.

As a standard procedure, all women who enter the recovery homes take a pregnancy test. Kalpa's test came back positive. Not yet a believer in Jesus, Kalpa wanted an abortion.

But Kalpa experienced love in the home. People spoke with her about the baby inside, and Kalpa bravely decided to give life to her baby. As the months passed, Kalpa learned vocational skills and eventually gave her heart to Jesus. She declared one day, "I want my baby to live. But I think it's best to place the baby for adoption." Before delivery, 10/40 and partners began to work to find a home for the baby.



Recently Kalpa gave birth to a beautiful baby girl and the baby was adopted by a loving Christian Nepali family who named her "Angel." Kalpa has now returned to her village with newly acquired tailoring skills. She desires to share the Gospel with her family and neighbors, trapped in cycles of poverty, oppression and hopelessness.

Rescue, Salvation, Birth, Adoption, Gospel multiplied. Kalpa's dramatic story, which began with evil, reveals God's ability to care for the whole person and the multiple ways that 10/40 Connections seeks to offer both life and hope.












EMPOWER AT-RISK CHILDREN


INNOVATE MINISTRIES

SOURCE OF FUNDS




USE OF FUNDS

EQUIP BELIEVERS

- 29 Ummeed church planter trainings equipped 1,572 people, including 374 grass roots church planters.
- 4000+ house churches have been planted among 59 least reached people groups in North India since 2007.

FIGHT INJUSTICE

- 6 TraffickStop border stations counseled over 15,000 and rescued 688 women from human trafficking.
- 24 TraffickStop border workers caught 96 traffickers.
- 41 local leaders equipped in *Voice for the Voiceless* curriculum.

EMPOWER AT-RISK CHILDREN

- 16 Lunch Change slum schools educated and fed 491 children.
- 17 Arise Home girls received education in a Christian school.
